> We are committed to widening access to the School for talented girls who show great promise, yet who would otherwise have been unable to consider such a pathway.


We are determined to provide an outstanding education for those who have the potential to succeed, but not the means.




YOUR PROMISE

TAX EFFICIENT GIVING

TAX
If you are a UK tax payer, giving to the
Transformational Bursary programme with Gift
Aid enables us to increase the value of your
gift by up to 25%, at no additional cost to you.

To make a Gift Aid donation you must pay as much Income Tax and/or Capital Gains Tax as the amount reclaimed by Francis Holland Schools. This is currently 25 pence for every pound donated.

Higher-rate tax payers who make a donation through Gift Aid may claim extra relief by claiming the difference between the higher rate of tax (40% and/or 45%) and the basic 20% rate of tax on the total gross value of the donation.
